

City of Derby and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)

The mission of the ADA Advisory Board is to work towards full compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act with respect to all city facilities and activities, including but not limited to:

- Identifying problems with program accessibility
- Establishing timelines for ADA improvements to be made
- Advocating for improvements that will increase the city's ADA accessibility

The ADA Advisory Board serves as a recommending body to the City Council. Three of the six board members are required to have a disability or have family members with a disability or be representatives of an organization or group that provides services to people with disabilities. Six members are elected to serve two-year terms. Meetings are held quarterly on the second Monday of the month at Derby City Hall at 4 p.m.

Board members assist with sensitivity training for city employees and can provide free employee training for businesses.
