

FYI on the 4th of July

If you plan to celebrate the holiday at your home, please make note of the following rules and regulations outlined by the City of Derby.

When can I buy fireworks?

Fireworks can be sold in Derby between June 27 and July 5. Please remember - shoot them where you buy them. Fireworks purchased out of state may be illegal in Derby. Possession of illegal fireworks may result in confiscation and/or a fine of up to \$500.

When can I shoot fireworks?

June 27-July 3	8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.
July 4	8:00 a.m. to Midnight
July 5	8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Possession of illegal fireworks is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to \$500. Bottle rockets are not allowed in the Derby city limits.

Where can't I shoot fireworks?

- Within 100 feet of any gasoline pump, filling station, bulk station or any building in which gasoline or flammable liquids are sold in quantities of more than one gallon, except in stores where cleaners, paints and oils are handled in sealed containers only.
- Into, under or on a car, whether moving or standing still.
- On a public roadway or the right-of-way adjoining a public roadway.
- Within 100 feet of any retail fireworks stand or facility where fireworks are stored.
