Fireworks Ordinance

When can I buy fireworks?

Fireworks can be sold in Derby between June 27 and July 5.

Please remember to shoot fireworks where you buy them. Fireworks purchased out of state or outside the city limits may be illegal in the City of Derby. Possession of illegal fireworks, such as bottle rockets, is a misdemeanor and may result in confiscation and/or a fine of up to \$500.

When can I shoot fireworks?

June 27-July 3	8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.
July 4	8:00 a.m. to Midnight
July 5	8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Please be courteous to your neighbors and follow these rules.

Where is shooting fireworks prohibited?

- Within 100 feet of any gasoline pump, filling station, or any building in which gasoline or flammable liquids are sold in quantities of more than one gallon, except in locations where flammables are handled in sealed containers only.
- Within 100 feet of any retail fireworks stand or facility where fireworks are stored.
- From, into, out of, on, under, or in the direction of a car, whether moving or stationary.
- On any state highway or arterial or collector street as designated by the City of Derby (this includes residential streets).
- On public property, including parks.

Fireworks Safety Tips

- Read and follow label instructions.
- Purchase high quality fireworks from a reliable, legitimate source.
- Remember, alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Have a "designated shooter."
- Don't give fireworks to young children, and make sure older children are supervised by an adult.
- Wear eye protection when lighting fireworks.
- Don't ignite fireworks indoors, and ensure your outdoor area is safe for firework use.
- Don't point or throw fireworks at a person, animal or building.
- Have a source of water nearby in case of a fire.
- Don't shoot fireworks in a glass or metal container.
- Light only one firework at a time.
- Don't attempt to re-light malfunctioning fireworks.
- When lighting fireworks, don't position any part of your body over them.
- Don't carry fireworks in your pocket.
- Store fireworks in a cool, dry place.
- Don't experiment with homemade fireworks. They are dangerous and illegal.

Fireworks Enforcement

The Derby Police Department responds to calls from citizens concerning illegal use of fireworks.

If you need to report illegal use of fireworks, please call the Derby Police Department at 788-8888.

The most frequent complaint received by the police department involves fireworks being used outside of the permitted dates and times.

Police officers have three options to enforce violations of these restrictions.

Options include:

- 1) advice and warning;
- 2) confiscation of fireworks; or
- 3) issuance of a uniform criminal complaint and notice to appear in municipal court.

Violation of the fireworks ordinance is a Class C misdemeanor, unless otherwise specified. Penalty for violation is up to \$500 in fines and up to one month in jail.

Officers have the authority to issue criminal complaints on violations that they personally observe. When responding to a call involving a violation observed by a third party (calling party), the officer must rely on the third party to sign the complaint and appear as a witness in Municipal Court.

In situations where the third party does not want to be contacted or refuses to sign the complaint, the officer will verbally warn those violating the fireworks ordinance of the consequences of their actions. In most cases, verbally warning a person that they are in violation of the ordinance solves the problem. If not, then a citation will be issued.
